

Background of Earth Hour and Climate Week 2016

Earth hour is a global movement to raise awareness about climate change and environmental protection, first organised by World Wide Fund for Nature (WWF) in 2007. The 10 year anniversary takes place on 19th March 2016 at 8.30-9.30pm when individuals and organisations around the world will switch off lights for Earth Hour.

Climate Week, in the run-up to Earth Hour, will see a programme of events around Aberdeen taking place particularly during climate week from 12th to 20th March 2016.

Hazlehead Park-Scotland's First Climate Change Park

Hazlehead Park has gained the distinction of being recognised as Scotland's first "Climate Change Park." The award has been made by Greenspace Scotland, a self funding body with aims of supporting the development and sustainable management of greenspaces for the benefit of people in urban Scotland. Hazlehead was recognised as having the potential for projects that will develop the park along lines that are more sustainable such as: energy efficiency, waste management, and adaption for the effects of climate change. Greenspace has produced a report with input from various local bodies including the Friends of Hazlehead. This will lead to a series of short term and longer term projects for which funding will be sought from various national bodies and sponsors.

Film: Chasing Ice

Sunday 13th March

Impressively beautiful photography, following the journey of discovery of photographer James Balog who sets off to document changes occurring to the world's prominent glaciers. An epic tale well told, truly



stunning and mesmerising images, all resulting in enlightening and rather disconcerting timelapse images. Both story and images are aweinspiring; a must see on the big screen!

Film: Bikes vs. Cars

Monday 14th March

As both climate change and never-ending gridlocks frustrate people more than ever, in cities



all over the world the bicycle is being taken on as a Do It Yourself solution. The film follows individuals around the world who are fighting to create change, sometimes with -but often against- the existing powers. "The reality is: there is not one city in the world that has solved the issue of mobility through the private car." An inspiration for cyclists and motorists alike.

Film: Merchants of Doubt

Thursday 17th March

Decades after deadly risks of tobacco were proven,



"uncertainty" was everywhere. Decades after the enormous threat of Climate Change was clear, loud voices still doubt. Coincidence? In-depth and now established research exposes how these (and several other) large scale deceits of the public were designed and executed, and how few individuals they take to sustain. If you ever wonder how your opinion can be influenced by strangers, this film is a must.

Film: This Changes Everything

Friday 18th March

An epic attempt to re-imagine the vast challenge of climate change. Inspired by Naomi Klein's bestseller This Changes Everything, filmed in five continents over



four years, the film presents seven powerful portraits of communities on the front lines. Interwoven with these stories of struggle is Klein's narration, connecting the carbon in the air with the economic system that put it there. "Can the existential crisis of climate change help transform our failed economic system into something better?"

Film: Ice and the Sky

Saturday 19th March

Luc Jacquet (March of the Penguins) tells the story of climatologist



Claude Lorius (83), whose life of drilling and analysing ice cores proved key in linking climate change and "greenhouse" gases. It leads us from discovery of the link between temperature and hydrogen isotopes, to the insight that led to analysis of entrained gas bubbles. Lorius says what he found and what it means with calm detachment in this gentle and reflective masterpiece. Guardian: "This is a powerful testament, and one that ought to have a considerable impact."



Powering Aberdeen is Aberdeen's first Sustainable Energy Action Plan (SEAP) as required by the European Union's Covenant of Mayors (CoM) initiative. It is a key document that outlines Aberdeen's aspirations to reduce emissions and establish alternative forms of energy; aligning to the principles of Earth Hour. It is a major strategic programme that forms an important part of the development of the North East of Scotland.

Powering Aberdeen covers Aberdeen city, however its implications are transboundary. As such it is recognised within the Aberdeen City and Shire Strategic Development Plan and forms part of the North East Sustainable Energy Action Plan as led by Aberdeenshire Council. It is hoped that through implementation of the action plan. Aberdeen will start the journey towards an economic, social and environmental transformation covering many themes such as energy, water, waste, transport, construction, planning, health and wellbeing. Working with multiple stakeholders including citizens, businesses and the public sector, they will be empowered to make informed choices regarding their future.

Whilst energy is the key driver of the CoM it is important to acknowledge the wider significant

benefits Powering Aberdeen will bring, including those upon the economy, market diversification, health and wellbeing, innovation, research and development and city resilience to a changing and uncertain future.

Powering Aberdeen will provide the political commitment, leadership and planning necessary for a low emission Aberdeen; reducing the city and region's dependence upon finite resources and diversifying the energy mix. This delivery model will seek to utilise existing policies, plans and strategies through collaborative partnerships to ensure actions are delivered. By taking such a holistic approach it is envisaged such thinking will be integrated into actions spanning themes such as planning, construction, transport, waste, energy, health and wellbeing.

It is recognised that Powering Aberdeen is ambitious. However, the proposed action plan has been identified by recognising best practice across other European cities and learning from others in their attempts to succeed. It is hoped we can build upon this expertise.

Climate change building resilience

How will the climate change in Aberdeen? Recent impacts from high rainfall and flooding in the region have shown how severe weather is affecting the region. Climate change projections indicate these weather incidences will increase in frequency in the future, with warmer winters and an increase in winter rainfall intensity; hotter, drier summers; and a rise in sea level expected.

Demonstrating commitment to addressing climate change, Aberdeen City Council is part of a risk task team working with Adaptation Scotland to develop a public bodies approach to assessing climate risks.

Climate change presents significant implications for Council services and operations, bringing both threats and opportunities. This will include direct and indirect impacts on buildings and infrastructure, the natural environment and society.

Taking a cross-service overview of climate risks will help to assess vulnerability and help examine how to manage risks and build resilience to future extreme weather.

The work is taking place as part of wider adaptation planning for the city which aims to build capacity and resilience and ensure statutory obligations are being effectively met. The approach will require a shift from short term

decision making based on the experiences of current weather, to one that considers the future climate. Measures include integrating adaptation into decision making to address climate change issues.

By participating in events such as Earth Hour, Aberdeen can increase awareness of climate change and build understanding of the consequences of a changing climate.
